A Prayer Vigil for Peace in a Time of Hate and Violence

Leader: We are called to act with love and justice. Following the horrific massacre of 49 people in Orlando, Cardinal Wuerl called on us to "stand together with all people of good will in making another impassioned appeal for peace and security in our communities and throughout the world. Let us also glorify God by responding to evil with love." Especially in this time of tragedy, all people of faith need to have the courage and love to assure the LGBTQ community, the Latino community, and the Muslim community that we stand with them in solidarity. May our faith unite us in care for one another.

We pray for victims of violence and terror...for their families and friends...and all those affected by such acts against God's love.

We pray ... that God's mercy and love will be upon us as we seek healing and consolation.

Every time we look at the Cross, we see how God has forgiven us in Christ

With a love that bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things; love never fails.

We dry the tears of those who weep and mourn as gently as Veronica wiped the Lord's bleeding face on the Via Dolorosa.

May the peace of Christ dwell within our hearts. Amen.

First Reading: A reading from the Letter of St. Paul to the Galatians, 3:23-28

²³Now before faith came, we were held captive under the law, imprisoned until the coming faith would be revealed. ²⁴So then, the law was our guardian until Christ came, in order that we might be justified by faith. ²⁵But now that faith has come, we are no longer under a guardian, ²⁶for in Christ Jesus you are all sons of God, through faith. ²⁷For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ. ²⁸There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is no male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus.

3. We reaffirm our commitment with Pope Francis to address the causes of such tragedy, including easy access to deadly weapons, praying that we will act as the gospel requires.

4. We reflect on the contribution of homophobic attitudes and statements to the treatment of LGBTQ people, praying that we may speak clearly about the role these attitudes and statements play in portraying people as less than human and deserving of punishment.

5. We stand in solidarity with our children and with all parents and loved ones of LGBTQ people as we remember those lost and those in pain, praying for the courage to grow in our ability to love and advocate for all of God's children.

6. We seek to act as partners on the path of freedom, taking down each stifling wall as we open doors of welcome, praying that You will bring hope and joy to all.

7. We acknowledge those deprived of freedom and all who are oppressed because of what they believe or what they are, praying that You will rescue them.
